	HIP REPORT WALTER JACKSON		2.2.87 3:10PM JACKSON then went to consult Supt Greenwood and other officers. He understood from Supt Greenwood that he was dealing with 'a crushing incident'. On a brief walk around the stadium ACC Jackson did not visit pens 3 and 4 before returning to the Control Box where, as he later described, the atmosphere was 'hyped up quite considerably, and lots of things were happening'. He 'considered that [he] was in command of a major, a major, developing major incident'.														2.2.88 When ACC Jackson had arrived on the pitch, Supt Greenwood assumed that, as the senior officer at the match, he would organise the necessary support and with those in the Control Box being aware of the seriousness of the situation, he would take control. Supt Greenwood, however, felt 'as if I was dealing with the disaster alone'.														We met Mr Barron, a Director of Sheffield Wednesday Football Club on the pitch and he said the police had done an excellent job. He was clearly upset and crying.
